This premier inter-district competition will be held at the Roskill and Districts Hall 6-8 September. The shock failure of last year's Welch Trophy champions, Otago, to qualify has thrown the door wide open for the 2000 winners Manawatu. The Welch Trophy is held annually and is contested by the six districts that have won their Paterson Trophy round robin

competitions. Only Manawatu and Canterbury have survived from last year's final. The other finalists are Auckland, Upper Hutt Valley, North Taranaki and Southland.

NZ MIXED FOURS FINAL

Steve Mills, Gavin Eccles, Linda Mills and Noma Whitehead from the Mairangi Bay, North Shore won this title held recently in Napier. The competition involved eight teams, which had already won their district and zone finals.

The final game between North Shore and Otago decided the title. The game ended in a draw 7-7, which was sufficient to give North Shore the win with a total of 11 game points. Hutt Valley took out the runner up spot with 10 points with Otago finishing 3rd with nine game points.

NZ JUNIOR SINGLES

An extremely talented field of 36 young bowlers have won their way through to play in the 25th national final to be held at the Barbar Hall, Palmerston North on Saturday 24 August. They include the defending title holder 13 year old Kyle Hinton, Central Otago, as well as last year's runner up Brandon Fuge, Hutt Valley. Hinton featured at the South Island championships this year finishing third equal in the triples with his grandparents Ken and Marj Hinton. Also in the field is Jason McAdam, Upper Hutt Valley, who won the Cliff Thompson Trophy at this year's Lion Foundation National Championships. Another competitor is Hayden Warnes (Nelson) who is the youngest player to have won a national championship title. He also finished third equal in the 1999 national championship pairs with his father Nigel. This is his third trip to the junior singles final. Anthony Mason (Bush Ruahine) is

making his sixth appearance and Darryn Le Frantz (GB-Mot) his fifth. The youngest players in the field this year are two eleven years olds, Shane Moore (Poverty Bay) and Andrew McMillan (Roskill & Dist). Also included is Andrew Townsend (Buller) who has played in the Special Olympics twice and won two gold, one silver and one bronze medal. Good luck to them all
